


Working with Anchors

You may find yourself with a large page full of text with important details throughout. The Sponsor-ed system has a way of indexing this information – so that through the click of a button, the user is taken to the relevant information on that page. This is done through the use of anchors. The important information is indexed at the top of the page, and once clicked on, the user is linked to the area of interest.

Creating your Index

Open your page – and create an index of important terms at the top. In this instance, we are using the history of the various sport teams at a school. Type your index at the top of the page like this:

Inserting Anchors

Once you have decided upon your index – you must find the relevant areas to anchor.

Lourdes is our first anchor. Find the information that is relevant to Lourdes (in this case, to the left of the heading “Lourdes” and click on the Anchor button in your toolbar.



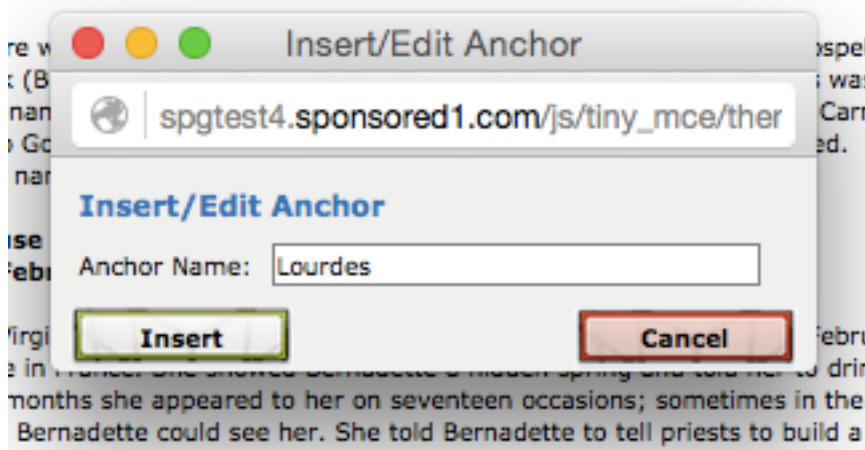

Carmel

Mount Carmel in the land of Israel has been a symbol of beauty and holiness. Revered as holy, it became a place set apart for prayer and contemplation. When the Crusaders came to the Holy Land, they came to see Mount Carmel as a true symbol of Mary, Mother of God. In the time of the Crusades in the Medieval Church, the Carmelite Order was founded. The mystical traditions of Mount Carmel, under the patronage of Mary, were preserved. In 1251, the Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, one of the early leaders of the Carmelites, who would devoutly wear the Brown Scapular of Mount Carmel.

Fatima House is named after "Our Lady of Fatima" (Feast Day May 13)

Fatima

In the small Portuguese village of Fatima, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three children. On six occasions between May and October, 1917, Our Lady appeared to three children, two cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, and one girl, Lucia. According to an account of the apparitions, the children were entrusted with three secrets and encouraged them to do penance every day. Thousands of people came to Fatima upon hearing of the visions. Many people reportedly witnessed a miraculous solar event. Fatima is now a major pilgrimage site.

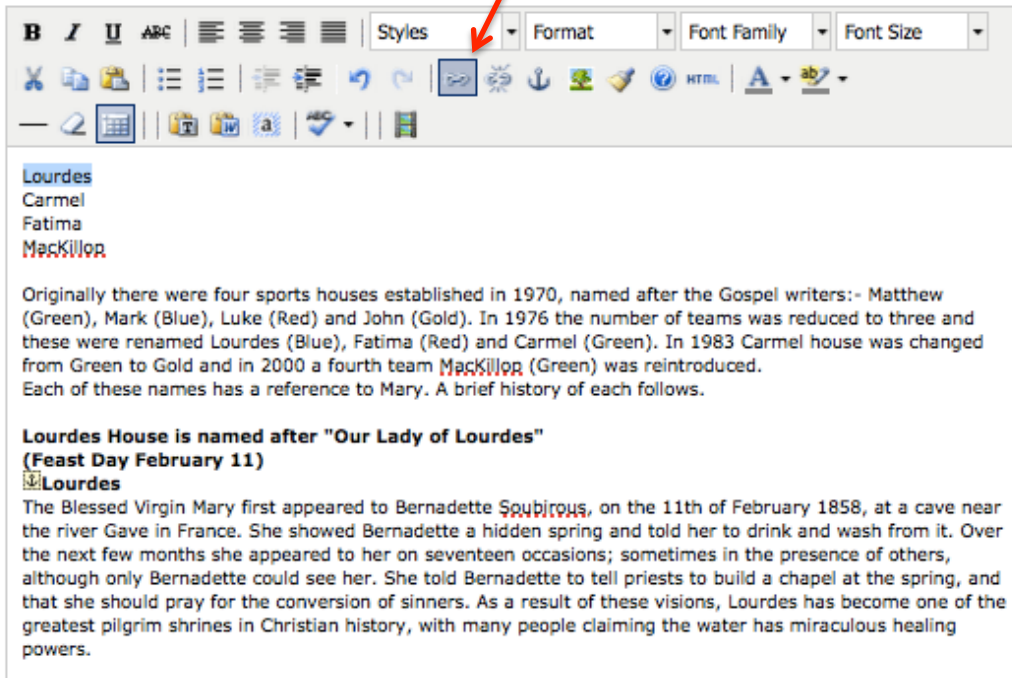
MacKillop House is named after "Mary MacKillop" (Feast Day August 8)

MacKillop

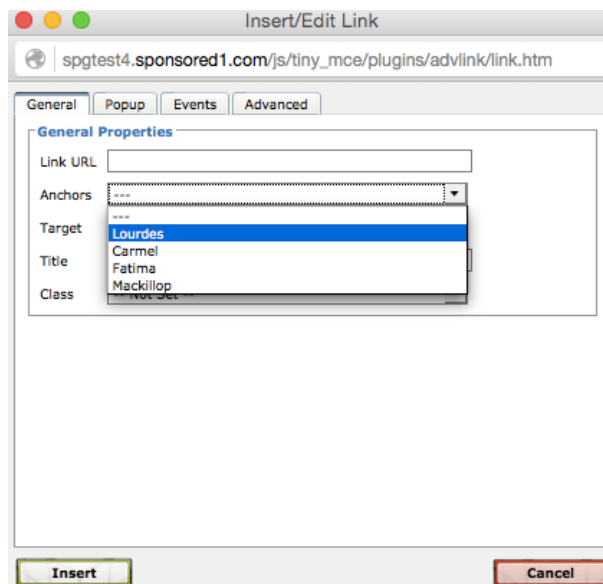
Mary MacKillop, known also as St Mary of the Cross, was born in Fitzroy, Victoria, to Scottish immigrants. In 1861 she moved to the small town of Perth, Western Australia, with her sister Julian Tenison Woods. Together they established Australia's first free-run religious order, the Sisters of St Joseph, and took over the operation of schools under her care, but Mary's refusal to abide by the rules of the order resulted in her communication from the church. She was accepted back a year later. She was accepted by the Bishops for her work with the poor. Mary was canonised by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009. She was the first Australian to be recognised by the Catholic Church as a saint.

Working with Anchors

Once you have inserted anchors for your index items, go back to your index and highlight the first item then click on Insert/Edit link button



You will see there is a drop down menu for Anchors – use this menu to select the anchor for the index item you are currently working with.
